

The preselected applicants will follow a matchmaking process allowing them to prepare and submit a joint proposal to the Better Factory 2nd Open call for Full Proposals (to be announced in August 2022).

2.1 Guidelines



Guidelines for a Call for Expressions-of-Interest (EoIs) from Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps

2.1.1 Introduction to Better Factory

Better Factory is an EU initiative to help Small and Medium sized (SMEs) European manufacturers to enter new markets. For SMEs to explore new markets Better Factory provides:

- **Reduction of production cost** by optimizing the use production resources (material, space, energy, water, machines, labour, logistics, etc.) and production planning. Better Factory will connect manufacturing SMES with companies who have proven technologies in production optimization.
- **Redesigning of products** so they can be easily customised or personalised for individual customers. Better Factory will connect manufacturing SMEs with experienced design artists.
- **Financial and business consultancy** to improve production, develop new products and create new business strategy.

The SME will be given access to Robotics and Automation MarketPlace (RAMP – <u>www.RAMP.eu</u>). RAMP is a Business-to-Business (B2B) internet marketplace for the manufacturing SMEs. Through RAMP, manufacturing SMEs can buy production automation technologies, purchase product design services, and hire financial and business consultants.



To test and validate the transfer of technology and services on the RAMP, Better Factory is launching a **Knowledge Transfer Program**. In this Knowledge Transfer Program, **Better Factory will select 9 (nine)** manufacturing SMEs, 9 (nine) Technology Suppliers and 9 (nine) Artists. Each consortium of the trio (manufacturing SME + Technology Supplier + Artists) is referred to as a **Knowledge Transfer Experiment (KTE)**. These KTEs will include artists for artistic experimentation in the spirit of S+T+ARTS residencies program of the European Commission (see starts.eu). The KTEs will be supported to design new product lines and deploy automation solutions in the factory.

Better Factory will provide **up to EUR 200,000 to the 9 selected KTEs** and full support to the manufacturing SME/Mid-Cap to explore the possibilities of optimising their production and improving their products' design. If you are interested in improving your product design and your production, apply to this Call. By submitting your Expression of Interest, you will enter a pre-selection process and, if validated, the Better Factory consortium will assist you in identifying Artist and Tech Supplier partners to form the consortium for the full proposal call.

2.1.2 Overview and Summary of the Open Call Process

These guidelines summarise the main features of the **Call for Expressions of Interest (Eols)**, as a preliminary step to apply to the 2nd Better Factory Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia that will end up with the selection of 9 KTEs.

This Call for EoIs will be open

From **25 April 2022** at 00:00 CEST Until **25 June 2022** at 17:00 CEST

With this Call for EoIs, Better Factory is looking for **Manufacturing SMEs and Mid-Caps** willing to redesign their current products and services and optimising their production cost together with product design Artists and automation Technology Suppliers.

The following industrial manufacturing sectors are prioritised:

- Plastic and Rubber;
- Furniture and Wood;
- Food and Agriculture;
- Construction;
- Metal and Machinery;
- Textile and Leather.

Manufacturing SMEs and Mid-Caps are invited to submit their EoI in the 2nd Better Factory Open Call.

The main objective of the EoIs is to find the best product design and production optimisation challenges. During this process, the Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps will be able to find product design Artists and automation Technology Suppliers to support them to address these challenges and thus, ensure that a successful consortium and KTE is created.

The pre-selected individual applicants will be assisted by the Better Factory consortium to form the consortium which will be further supported to create and submit the full proposal.

<u>Technology Suppliers</u> and <u>Artists</u> are invited to apply in the 2nd Better Factory Call for Experts separately.

The steps within the 2nd Factory Better Open Call until the start of the Knowledge Transfer Program are as follows:

- 1. Expressions of Interest submission by Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps (25 April-25 June 2022);
- 2. **Matchmaking process** for the pre-selected individual applicants, with the support of the Better Factory consortium (23 May-14 October 2022);
- 3. **Full proposal from consortia** preparation and submission by the matchmade consortium with Better Factory mentorship (1 September-15 November 2022);
- 4. Selection process of the full proposals submitted by consortia. This step will be fully detailed in the Guide for Applicants for Full Proposals (16 November 2022-end of January 2023).

2.1.2.1 Expressions of Interest submission

Every Manufacturing SME/Mid-Cap should complete an online application form, and asnwer 28 questions to verify if compliance with the eligibility criteria for pre-selection in the Better Factory Call. This includes contact and legal information as well a digitization audit which will serve as a starting point for the Please make matchmaking process. sure you go to the online form at https://beta.ramp.eu/digitization_audit to fill in the questionnaire and upload it as pdf in the application form. The questionnaire and detailed explanations are available (at this link).

Any doubt about the formal aspects of the application modules, and IT issues of the submission system should be addressed to the <u>Helpdesk space</u>. Any other doubt regarding the content of the application will be directed to and properly addressed by the experts in the Better Factory pre-selection sub-committee for Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps.

This call for Expressions of Interest is open from **25 April 2022 at 00:00 CEST until 25 June 2022 at 17:00 CEST**. Only individual applications will be submitted during this period through the corresponding online platforms for each of the three categories of eligible applicants: Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps, Artists and Technology Suppliers.

2.1.2.2 Project information

2.1.2.3 Resources

2.1.3 Matchmaking process

2.1.3.1 Registration in RAMP

After the EoI has been submitted, a pre-selection process will be performed according to the criteria described in section 4.

The pre-selected applicant will be informed via e-mail and invited to register on RAMP following the instructions that will be provided by the Better Factory consortium. An invitation to register on RAMP will be sent after the pre-selection process is completed.

Based on the given challenge expressed by the Manufacturing SMEs through the Expression-of-Interest (EoI), a progressive matchmaking with Technology suppliers and Artists will be initiated to ensure the creation of quality teams (consortia) that will prepare and submit their proposals to the Open Call for Full Proposals.

The matchmaking process will start as soon as the Tech Suppliers and the SMEs/Mid-Caps have defined their challenges to the Artists. The challenges will be published in the Co-creation Space of the RAMP Marketplace.

2.1.3.2 Contacting Artists and Tech Suppliers

The match-making process between Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Technology Suppliers will be supported through different means, including the Robotics and Automation Marketplace (RAMP). RAMP is the space where Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps will upload and disseminate their product portfolio, to be findable by Technology Suppliers to get in contact with them, to co-create their technical challenges. Once the Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps have defined their challenges with the Technology Suppliers, Artists will be engaged, to develop, modify and individualise their products or design and develop new products and services. The pre-selected applicants will continuously be supported by members of the Better Factory consortium in every step of the process.

2.1.3.3 Full proposal from Consortia

Once the matchmaking process is completed, **Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-caps**, Technology Suppliers and Artists, acting as a Consortium and supported by Better Factory consortium, will collaborate to create joint proposal to be submitted to the Better Factory **2nd Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia.** The artists will be part of the STARTS residency program and will contribute, in the spirit of this program, to artistic experimentation with technology to facilitate new uses of technology and to allow technology providers to make their technologies compatible with humans.

The Better Factory Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia will be launched in September 2022.


In the 2nd Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia, eligible consortia are composed of **1 Manufacturing** SME/Mid-Cap + 1 Artist + 1 Technology Supplier.

Better Factory will provide the template for the full proposal and will support the pre-selected applicants to write the full proposal.

The evaluation of the proposals follows these steps:

- **Proposals submission**: full proposals by consortia of 1 manufacturing SME/Mid-Cap, 1 artist and 1 tech supplier.
- **Eligibility checks**: proposals which do not comply with the 'eligibility criteria' defined in the Guide for Applicants will be excluded and will not be shortlisted for the 'Eligible Applicants List'.
- Internal /external evaluation: individual evaluators, read and score the eligible proposals according to the established selection criteria.
- **Consensus meeting:** the 'Selection Committee' will consider the individual evaluation and will agree on the final score for each proposal and the 'Ranking List' of the best proposals.
- **Jury Day**: A Jury Day will be organised, to which 16 finalists will be invited to present their proposals for a final jury decision of the proposals which will be funded.

After the Jury Day, the winning proposals will be invited to provide some additional documents to validate their legal existence and a Sub-Grant Agreement will be signed.



2.1.4 What do we offer?

As mentioned before, Better Factory will fund 9 Knowledge Transfer Experiments (KTEs) via the 2nd Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia.

Up to **EUR 200,000 (total lump sum)** will be distributed to each one of the selected KTEs, based upon the successful delivery of technical and business reports along the 16-month Technology Transfer Program. This lump sum will be distributed among the KTE partners as follows:

 Manufacturing SME or Mid-Caps: 	up to EUR 50,000
Artists:	up to EUR 50,000
 Technology Suppliers: 	up to EUR 100,000

The value proposition for Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps will be as follows:

- Connect with adequate Artists and automation Technology suppliers.
- Expand your business with new products and services.
- Test new technologies to turn your factory into a Lean-Agile production facility.
- Receive technical mentoring on your factory digital transformation.
- Get up to **EUR 50,000** for executing your experiment in a consortium with one Artist and one Tech Supplier.

2.1.5 Manufacturing SMEs/MID-CAPs Eligibility Criteria

All Manufacturing SMEs must abide to all general requirements described in the Guidelines to be **eligible** for the 2nd Better Factory preliminary call.

2.1.5.1 What types of entities are eligible?

Manufacturing SMEs and Mid-Caps, legally established in an eligible country as defined in 3.2, are eligible when they conform to the following:

A **Manufacturing SME** must comply with the <u>Commission Recommendation 2003/361/EC</u> (available here: <u>http://ec.europa.eu/growth/smes/business-friendly-environment/sme-definition_en</u>). As a summary, the criteria which define a SME are:

• Headcount in Annual Work Units (AWU) less than 250;

• **Annual turnover** less or equal to EUR 50 million OR annual balance sheet total less or equal to EUR 43 million.

Regarding **Mid-Caps**, there is no common EU definition. For the purposes of Better Factory, we are defining a Mid-Cap as:

• A company that is not an SME and has a headcount of up to 3,000 AWU.

Please note that an SME or a Mid-Cap owned by a company bigger than a Mid-Cap – i.e., having a shareholder with more than 50% of the shares whose headcount is higher than 3,000 – will be considered as a Big Company and will not be eligible to apply to this Call for EoIs.

2.1.5.2 Eligible countries

Only SMEs and Mid-Caps legally established in any of the eligible countries will be eligible for the Better Factory calls. The eligible countries include:

- The **Member States of the European Union:** Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain and Sweden;
- H2020 Associated Countries, as identified in Article 7 of the Horizon 2020 Regulation: Iceland, Norway, Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia, Turkey, Israel, Moldova, Switzerland, Faroe Islands, Ukraine, Tunisia, Georgia and Armenia.
- United Kingdom.

2.1.5.3 English language

English is the official language for the Better Factory open calls. The proposal must be in English in all its mandatory parts to be eligible. If the mandatory parts of the proposal are in any other language, the entire will not be eligible.

If only nonmandatory parts of a proposal are submitted in a language different from English, those parts will not be evaluated but the proposal is still eligible.

2.1.6 Manufacturing SMEs/MID-CAPs Pre-Selection Criteria And Process

2.1.6.1 Administrative and Eligibility Check

Call managers will evaluate the eligibility of the proposal according to the following criteria:

- Applicants are from an eligible country.
- The ability to work in English.
- All the mandatory fields in the application form are filled.
- The applicants provided sufficient information to define their challenges.

The eligibility check process will be performed on all the proposals submitted before the deadline. The applications that do not comply with the criteria above will be excluded and marked as ineligible.

Eligible applications will then be evaluated by the pre-selection sub-committee for Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps of the Better Factory consortium.

2.1.6.2 Innovative challenges and technologies addressed by the EoIs

Better Factory consortium has created a pre-selection sub-committee which will act also as contact point for Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps. The sub-committee will support the applicants technically (i.e., challenges to be addressed, technologies to be used, etc.) and address any content related doubts. The Better Factory consortium will ensure transparent and equal dissemination of all information to all interested parties.

The EoIs which already have commercialised the potential solution. will not be selected for the project but will be put in contact with potential providers for addressing their specific needs.


2.1.6.3 Who does the pre-selection?



Only the information included in the application form and in the attachments to the form will be considered. It is the applicant's responsibility to include all the necessary information in the form, which is available in <u>Word format</u> if working off-line is needed before fulfilling the online application.

Eols can be received throughout the 2-month call for submission period, and applicants will be notified about the results at a weekly basis. The Call will be continuously open for applications, as the objective is to have a wide pool of Eols from Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps.

Only EoI submitted before the deadline will be accepted. After the call closure no additions or changes to received EoI will be considered.

The deadline for the submission of EoIs is 25 June 2022 at 17:00 CEST.

2.1.7.2 Multiple submissions

Only one Expression of Interest per entity can be submitted to Better Factory in this call.

If more than one EoI per applicant is identified by the Better Factory team, only the first proposal which has been submitted in order of time, will be potentially pre-selected.



Guidelines for a Call for Experts from ARTISTS

PUBLIC

3.1.1 Introduction to Better Factory

Better Factory is an EU initiative to help Small and Medium sized (SMEs) European manufacturers to enter new markets. For SMEs to explore new markets Better Factory provides:

- **Reduction of production cost** by optimizing the use production resources (material, space, energy, water, machines, labour, logistics, etc.) and production planning. Better Factory will connect manufacturing SMES with companies who have proven technologies in production optimization.
- **Redesigning of products** so they can be easily customised or personalised for individual customers. Better Factory will connect manufacturing SMEs with experienced design artists.
- **Financial and business consultancy** to improve production, develop new products and create new business strategy.

The SME will be given access to Robotics and Automation MarketPlace (RAMP – <u>www.RAMP.eu</u>). RAMP is a Business-to-Business (B2B) internet marketplace for the manufacturing SMEs. Through RAMP, manufacturing SMEs can buy production automation technologies, purchase product design services, and hire financial and business consultants.



To test and validate the transfer of technology and services on the RAMP, Better Factory is launching a **Knowledge Transfer Program**. In the Knowledge Transfer Program, **Better Factory will select 9 (nine)** manufacturing SMEs, 9 (nine) Technology Suppliers and 9 (nine) Artists. Each consortium of the trio (manufacturing SME + Technology Supplier + Artists) is referred to as a **Knowledge Transfer Experiment (KTE)**. These KTEs will include artists for artistic experimentation in the spirit of S+T+ARTS residencies program of the European Commission (see starts.eu). The KTEs will be supported to design new product lines and deploy automation solutions in the factory.

Better Factory will provide **up to EUR 200,000 to the 9 selected KTEs** and full support to the manufacturing SMEs to explore the possibilities of optimising their production and improving their products' design. If you are interested to bring your artistic contribution to the improvement of the product design within one of the manufacturing companies, apply to this Call for Experts from Artists. By submitting your individual application, you will enter a pre-selection process and, if validated, the Better Factory consortium will assist you in identifying the Manufacturing SME/Mid-cap and Tech Supplier partners to form the consortium for the full proposal call.

3.1.2 Overview and Summary of the Open Call Process

These guidelines summarise the main features of the **Call for Artists** as a preliminary step to apply to the 2^{nd} Better Factory Open Call that will end up with the selection of 9 KTEs.

This Call for Experts will be open

From **25 April 2022** at 00:00 CEST Until **25 June 2022** at 17:00 CEST

With this Call for Experts, Better Factory is looking for Artists willing to collaborate with Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Technology Suppliers for the redesign and co-creation of new products and services.

Special focus will be on how products can be customised, individualised and new services can be created around them.

This call is a great opportunity for **Artists** who seek to expand their creative frontiers in new manufacturing sectors. By participating in the Better Factory KTE experiment, Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Artists will be able to develop new partnerships and create innovative products and services.

The following industrial sectors are prioritised:

- Plastic and Rubber;
- Furniture and Wood;
- Food and Agriculture;
- Construction;
- Metal and Machinery;
- Textile and Leather.

The main objective of this Call is to identify Artists willing to redesign the products of Manufacturing SMEs for personalisation around the core value proposition of the products, or design new products and services based on the core knowledge of the SME. The pre-selected Artists will then enter a matchmaking process with Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Technology suppliers to ensure the creation of a high quality consortium that can submit successful proposal to the Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia and receive financial support to implement the manufacturing companies' challenges. The pre-selected individual applicants will be assisted by the Better Factory consortium to form the consortium as well as to create and submit the full proposal.

The steps within the 2nd Better Factory Open Call until the start of the Knowledge Transfer Program are as follows:

- 1. Individual application to the Artist call for experts (25 April-25 June 2022);
- 2. **Matchmaking process** for the pre-selected individual applicants, with the support of the Better Factory consortium (23 May-14 October 2022);
- 3. **Full proposal from consortia** preparation and submission by the matchmade consortium with Better Factory mentorship (1 September-15 November 2022);
- 4. **Selection process of the full proposals submitted by consortia**. This step will be fully detailed in the Guide for Applicants for Full Proposals (16 November 2022-end of January 2023).

3.1.2.1 Individual application to the Artist call for experts

For this call for experts, artists will be asked to fill an application form with:

- Basic personal and legal information
- Autonomous artistic experience and practice through a portfolio question showing proof of previous relevant work
- Application domains worked so far (including Summary of Services offered)
- Motivation and expectations.

Any doubt about the formal aspects of the application modules, and IT issues of the submission system should be addressed to the <u>Helpdesk space</u>. Any other doubt regarding the content of the application will be directed to and properly addressed by the experts in the Better Factory pre-selection sub-committee for Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps.

This call for experts is open from **25 April 2022 at 00:00 CEST until 25 June 2022 at 17:00 CEST**. Only individual applications will be submitted during this period through the corresponding online platforms for each of the three categories of eligible applicants: Artists, Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Technology Suppliers.

3.1.3 Matchmaking process

3.1.3.1 Registration in RAMP

After the individual application submission, Artists will enter a pre-selection process according to the criteria described in section 4 of the current document.

Pre-selected applicants will be informed via e-mail and invited to register on RAMP (instructions will be provided by the Better Factory consortium). An invitation to register on RAMP will be sent after the pre-selection process is completed.

The matchmaking process will start as soon as the Tech Suppliers and manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps have defined their challenges to the Artists. The progressive matchmaking will be initiated to ensure the creation of quality teams (consortia) that will prepare and submit their proposals to the Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia.

3.1.3.2 Contacting Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Tech suppliers

The contacts with Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Technology Suppliers will be supported through different means, including the Robotics and Automation Marketplace (RAMP). RAMP is the space where Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps will upload their product portfolio and through which Artists can get in contact with them, to develop, modify and individualise their products or develop new products and services. The pre-selected applicants will continuously be supported by members of the Better Factory consortium to ensure a proper matching among all the parties requested to execute the Experiment.

3.1.3.3 Full proposal from Consortia

Once the matchmaking process is completed, Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-caps, Technology Suppliers and **Artists**, acting as a Consortium and supported by Better Factory consortium, will collaborate to create full proposals to be submitted to the Better Factory 2nd Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia. The Artists will be part of the STARTS residency program and will contribute, in the spirit of this program, to artistic experimentation with technology to facilitate new uses of technology and to allow technology providers to make their technologies compatible with humans.


The Better Factory Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia will be launched in September 2022.

In the Open Call for Full Proposals, applicants will be forming consortia composed of **1 Manufacturing** SME/Mid-Cap + 1 Artist + 1 Technology Supplier.

Better Factory will provide the template for the full proposal and will support the pre-selected applicants to write the full proposal.

The evaluation of the proposals follows these steps:

- **Proposals submission**: full proposals by consortia of 1 manufacturing SME/Mid-Cap, 1 artist and 1 tech supplier.
- **Eligibility checks**: proposals which do not comply with the 'eligibility criteria' defined in the Guide for Applicants will be excluded and will not be shortlisted for the 'Eligible Applicants List'.
- Internal /external evaluation: individual evaluators, read and score the eligible proposals according to the established selection criteria.
- **Consensus meeting:** the 'Selection Committee' will consider the individual evaluation and will agree on the final score for each proposal and the 'Ranking List' of the best proposals.
- **Jury Day**: A Jury Day will be organised, to which 16 finalists will be invited to present their proposals for a final jury decision of the proposals which will be funded.
- After the Jury Day, the winning proposals will be invited to provide some additional documents to validate their legal existence and a Sub-Grant Agreement will be signed.



3.1.4 What do we offer?

As mentioned before, Better Factory will fund 9 Knowledge Transfer Experiments (KTEs) via the 2nd Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia.

Up to EUR 200,000 (total lump sum) will be distributed to each one of the selected KTEs, based upon the successful delivery of technical and business reports along the 16-month experiment program. This lump sum will be distributed among the KTE partners as follows:

•	Manufacturing SMEs or Mid-Caps:	up to EUR 50,000
•	Artists:	up to EUR 50,000
•	Technology Suppliers:	up to EUR 100,000

The value proposition for Artists will be as follows:

- Connect with Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps to create new products and services.
- Up to EUR 50,000 to demonstrate your creativity with Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps.
- Support to find additional customers and unleash your creativity.
- Mentorship throughout the program.
- Trainings on how to use the RAMP platform to connect between stakeholders.
- Sell your creative services on the RAMP platform to Manufacturing SMEs and Mid-Caps.

3.1.5 Artist Eligibility Criteria

All artists must abide to the general requirements described in the Guidelines to be considered eligible for 2nd Better Factory preliminary call.

3.1.5.1 What types of entities are eligible?

For this 2nd call for Artist Experts, Better Factory is looking for artists established in an eligible country as defined in 3.2.

Artist refers to entities registered under NACE Code '9003 Artistic creation' and self-employed individuals (freelancers) that undertake artistic activities as a profession/job occupation, such as performers, designers, etc.

Artists must have already produced several artworks and provide relevant evidence for the jury to evaluate their artistic experience. Artists must submit 2 to 4 works as examples of previous work through the

portfolio section in the application form. Previous experience collaborating with industry SMEs and technology providers will be preferred but does not represent a condition for participation.

<u>Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps</u> and <u>Technology suppliers</u> are invited to apply in the 2nd Better Factory Call for Experts separately. <u>For your information, please see their definition below:</u>

A **Manufacturing SME** must comply with the <u>Commission Recommendation 2003/361/EC</u> (available here: https://ec.europa.eu/growth/smes/sme-definition_en).

As a summary, the criteria which define a SME are:

- Headcount in Annual Work Units (AWU) less than 250;
- Annual turnover less or equal to EUR 50 million OR annual balance sheet total less or equal to EUR 43 million.

Regarding **Mid-Caps**, there is no common EU definition. Better Factory, defines a Mid-Cap as:

• A company that is not an SME and has a headcount of up to 3,000 AWU.

Technology Suppliers refer to companies (SMEs or Mid-Caps) that develop, produce and sell software applications and/or hardware to be implemented in Manufacturing companies.

3.1.5.2 Eligible countries

Artists legally established in any of the eligible countries will be eligible for the Better Factory calls. The eligible countries include:

- The Member States of the European Union: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain and Sweden;
- H2020 Associated Countries, as identified in Article 7 of the Horizon 2020 Regulation: Iceland, Norway, Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia, Turkey, Israel, Moldova, Switzerland, Faroe Islands, Ukraine, Tunisia, Georgia and Armenia.
- United Kingdom.

3.1.5.3 Expertise and other experience criteria

Since we are looking for artists who will work in a KTE together with a Manufacturing SME/Mid-Cap and a Technology supplier in a co-creation platform, the following criteria will be considered:

- Minimum 3 years autonomous work experience.
- Preferably 3 years of collaborative related experience (research related collaboration; experiment/science related collaboration; technology related collaboration; design related collaboration; material related collaboration; production related collaboration; audience related collaboration; artistic related collaboration; marketing related collaboration, co-creation, design thinking expertise, other);
- Shared proof of at least 2 conducted autonomous art projects featuring novel concepts such as circular /green/ intelligent manufacturing, or AI -based novel production processes.
- Background or professional experience preferably in one of these 6 prioritised sectors:
 - Plastic and Rubber;
 - Furniture and Wood;
 - Food and agriculture;
 - o Construction;
 - Metal and Machinery;
 - o Textile and Leather.
- Experience working with technological means of any kind and digital aids;

 Interest in work in a collaborative project preferably, such as: Mission Driven Collaborative projects (Exploring new paths to progress) or Challenge Driven collaborative projects (Humanising Technology).

3.1.5.4 English language

English is the official language for the Better Factory open calls communication, the applications and proposal. If the mandatory parts of the proposal are in any other language, the entire proposal will not be eligible.

If only nonmandatory parts of a proposal are submitted in a language different from English, those parts will not be evaluated but the proposal is still eligible.

3.1.6 Artist Pre-Selection Criteria and Process

The submitted Artists' applications, will be validated by the Better Factory art pre-selection sub-committee according to the eligibility criteria. The validated applicant will be contacted by the Better Factory consortium and will receive further information on how to register on RAMP.

The validation process consists of:

3.1.6.1 Administrative and Eligibility Check

Call managers will evaluate the eligibility of the proposal according to the following criteria:

- Applicant established in an eligible country (see 3.2);
- Capacity to work in English;
- Applicant is either a physical person, a collective of individuals or a company whose main activity, as professionals or students, is of artistic nature;
- All the mandatory fields in the application form are completed;
- The applicant provided sufficient information to evaluate their artistic experience.
- Proof of previous artistic works. The provided references are reliable and the assessment of the artist's work can be performed.

The eligibility check will be done on all proposals submitted before the deadline. The applications that do not comply with these criteria will be excluded and marked as ineligible.

Eligible applications will then be evaluated according to the Quality and Operational Capacity Criteria.

3.1.6.2 Quality and Operational Capacity Check

The second part of the validation process requires an in-depth assessment of the applicant. The quality and operational capacity of submitted applications will be reviewed by partner INOVA+, who will determine whether the applicant is qualified for the matchmaking process. The following criteria will be considered:

Artistic Experiment Criteria:

- 1. To what extent applicants have the experience and competence in the thematic field concerned or convincing description of how the current background can be useful in the targeted manufacturing areas, as well as the necessary capacity to successfully implement the idea (human resources, background)
- 2. Applicant's potential for growth (in terms of artistic potential) Portfolio, credentials and track record of the applicant (to be judged from artistic experience)
- 3. Innovativeness and feasibility of proposed general concept for the production industry and artistic community (for example illustration of innovative concepts of work and new target market).

Technology Criteria:

- 1. To what extent applicants have the experience and competence with technology to successfully collaborate in a KTE?
- 2. Applicant's potential for conducting experiments and growth (in terms of potential to work with technology / interest in technology / curiosity and motivation to learn about).

During the open call, the Better Factory sub-committee for Artist applicants will analyse periodically the applications received. The consortium will inform the pre-selected applicants by e-mail.



4.1 Guidelines



Guidelines for a Call from TECHNOLOGY SUPPLIERS

PUBLIC

4.1.1 Introduction to Better Factory

Better Factory is an EU initiative to help Small and Medium sized (SMEs) European manufacturers to enter new markets. For SMEs to explore new markets Better Factory provides:

- **Reduction of production cost** by optimizing the use production resources (material, space, energy, water, machines, labour, logistics, etc.) and production planning. Better Factory will connect manufacturing SMES with companies who have proven technologies in production optimization.
- **Redesigning of products** so they can be easily customised or personalised for individual customers. Better Factory will connect manufacturing SMEs with experienced design artists.
- **Financial and business consultancy** to improve production, develop new products and create new business strategy.

The SME will be given access to Robotics and Automation MarketPlace (RAMP – <u>www.RAMP.eu</u>). RAMP is a Business-to-Business (B2B) internet marketplace for the manufacturing SMEs. Through RAMP, manufacturing SMEs can buy production automation technologies, purchase product design services, and hire financial and business consultants.



To test and validate the transfer of technology and services on the RAMP, Better Factory is launching a **Knowledge Transfer Program**. In this Knowledge Transfer Program, **Better Factory will select 9 (nine)** manufacturing SMEs, 9 (nine) Technology Suppliers and 9 (nine) Artists. Each consortium of the trio (manufacturing SME + Technology Supplier + Artists) is referred to as a **Knowledge Transfer Experiment (KTE)**. These KTEs will include artists for artistic experimentation in the spirit of S+T+ARTS residencies program of the European Commission (see starts.eu). The KTEs will be supported to design new product lines and deploy automation solutions in the factory.

Better Factory will provide **up to EUR 200,000 to the 9 selected KTEs** and full support to the manufacturing SMEs to explore the possibilities of optimising their production and improving their products' design. If you are interested in contributing to the improvement of the production facility within one of the manufacturing companies, apply to this Call for Technology Suppliers. By submitting your individual application, you will enter a pre-selection process and, if validated, the Better Factory consortium will assist you in identifying the Manufacturing SME/Mid-cap and Artist partners to form the consortium for the full proposal call.

4.1.2 Overview and Summary of the Open Call Process

The following guidelines summarise the main features of this **Call for Technology Suppliers**, as a preliminary step to apply to the 2nd Better Factory Open Call that will end up with the selection of 9 KTEs.

This Call for Technology Suppliers will be open

From **25 April 2022** at 00:00 CEST Until **25 June 2022** at 17:00 CEST

With this Call, Better Factory is calling for **Technology Suppliers** that want to use advanced robotics and optimisation technologies for the optimisation of factory logistics, space, material, energy, labour, etc. for Lean-Agile production **in collaboration with Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Artists**.

Technology suppliers will support the factory transformation to an agile production facility, which not only meets the current production demands of the manufacturing companies but at the same time enables them to manufacture a range of new and/or personalised products. The focus will be to minimise the production cost for the manufacturing companies by deploying many advanced robotics and optimisation technology to minimise the use of waste, energy, resources and logistic.

This call is a great opportunity for Tech Suppliers who seek to expand their collaborations and to scale up their technology.

The following industrial manufacturing sectors are prioritised:

- Plastic and Rubber;
- Furniture and Wood;
- Food and Agriculture;
- Construction;
- Metal and Machinery;
- Textile and Leather.

The main objective of this call is to find the best production optimisation challenges based on the identified need of the manufacturing SME. The pre-selected Technology Suppliers will then enter a matchmaking process with Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Artists to ensure the creation of a high quality consortium that can submit successful proposals to the 2nd Better Factory Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia and receive financial support to implement the manufacturing companies' challenges. The pre-selected individual applicants will be assisted by the Better Factory consortium to form the consortium as well as to create and submit the full proposal.

<u>Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps</u> and <u>Artists</u> are invited to apply in the 2nd Better Factory Call for Experts separately.

The steps within the 2nd Factory Better Open Call until the start of the Knowledge Transfer Program are as follows:

- 1. Individual application to the Technology Suppliers call for experts (25 April-25 June 2022);
- 2. **Matchmaking process** for the pre-selected individual applicants, with the support of the Better Factory consortium (23 May-14 October 2022);
- 3. **Full proposal from consortia** preparation and submission by the matchmade consortium with Better Factory mentorship (1 September-15 November 2022);
- 4. Selection process of the full proposals submitted by consortia. This step will be fully detailed in the Guide for Applicants for Full Proposals (16 November 2022-end of January 2023).

4.1.2.1 Application to the Tech Suppliers call

On this call for Tech Suppliers, applicants will be asked to fill an application form with:

- Basic personal and legal information;
- Short description of your technical solutions, status of <u>technological readiness level (TRL)</u> and relevant industry sectors.
- Presence in international business or high market commercialisation potential.
- Research Development and Innovation, RDI co-operation experience;
- Type of organisation.

Any doubt about the formal aspects of the application modules, and IT issues of the submission system should be addressed to the <u>Helpdesk space</u>. Any other doubt regarding the content of the application will be directed to and properly addressed by the experts in the Better Factory pre-selection sub-committee for Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps.

This call for experts is open from **25 April 2022 at 00:00 CEST until 25 June 2022 at 17:00 CEST**. Only individual applications will be submitted during this period through the corresponding online platforms for

each of the three categories of eligible applicants: Artists, Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Technology Suppliers.

4.1.3 Matchmaking process

4.1.3.1 Registration in RAMP

After the individual application submission, a pre-selection process will be performed as described in section 4 of the current document.

Pre-selected applicants will be informed via e-mail and invited to register on RAMP (instructions will be provided by the Better Factory consortium). An invitation to register on RAMP will be sent after the pre-selection process is completed.

Based on a given challenge expressed by a Manufacturing SMEs through an Expression-of-Interest (EoI), a progressive matchmaking with Technology suppliers and Artists will be initiated to ensure the creation of quality teams (consortia) that will submit their proposals to the 2nd Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia.

The matchmaking process will start as soon as the Tech Suppliers and SMEs have defined their challenges to the Artists. The challenges will be published in the Co-creation Space of the RAMP Marketplace.

4.1.3.2 Contacting Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Artists

The contacts with Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps and Technology Suppliers will be supported through different means, including the Robotics and Automation Marketplace (RAMP). RAMP is the space where Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps will upload their product portfolio and through which Technology Suppliers can get in contact with them, to define their technical challenges. The pre-selected applicants will continuously be supported by members of the Better Factory consortium to ensure a proper matching among all the parties requested to execute the Experiment.

4.1.3.3 Full Proposal from Consortia

Once the matchmaking process is completed, Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps, **Technology Suppliers** and Artists, acting as a Consortium and supported by Better Factory consortium, will collaborate to create a joint proposal to be submitted to the Better Factory 2nd Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia.

The Better Factory Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia will be launched in September 2022.


In this Open Call, applicants will be forming consortia composed of **1 Manufacturing SME/Mid-Cap + 1 Artist + 1 Technology Supplier**.

Better Factory will provide the template for the full proposal and will support the pre-selected applicants to write the full proposal.

The evaluation of the proposals follows these steps:

- **Proposals submission**: full proposals by consortia of 1 manufacturing SME/Mid-Cap, 1 artist and 1 tech supplier.
- **Eligibility checks**: proposals which do not comply with the 'eligibility criteria' defined in the Guide for Applicants will be excluded and will not be shortlisted for the 'Eligible Applicants List'.
- Internal /external evaluation: individual evaluators, read and score the eligible proposals according to the established selection criteria.
- **Consensus meeting:** the 'Selection Committee' will consider the individual evaluation and will agree on the final score for each proposal and the 'Ranking List' of the best proposals.
- **Jury Day**: A Jury Day will be organised, to which 16 finalists will be invited to present their proposals for a final jury decision of the proposals which will be funded.

After the Jury Day, the winning proposals will be invited to provide some additional documents to validate their legal existence and a Sub-Grant Agreement will be signed.



4.1.4 What do we offer?

As aforementioned, Better Factory will fund 9 Knowledge Transfer Experiments (KTEs) via the 2nd Open Call for Full Proposals from Consortia.

Up to **EUR 200,000 (total lump sum)** will be distributed to each one of the selected KTEs, based upon the successful delivery of technical and business reports along the 16-month Technology Transfer Program. This lump sum will be distributed among the KTE partners as follows:

- Manufacturing SMEs or Mid-Caps: up to EUR 50,000
- Artists: up to EUR 50,000
- Technology Suppliers: up to EUR 100,000

The value proposition for Tech Suppliers will be as follows:

- Collaboration with Manufacturing SMEs, Artists and other Technology suppliers across Europe.
- Access to open and standardised Advance Production Planning and Scheduling tools for your customers.
- Funding of **up to EUR 100,000** for learning, testing and developing Agile-Production technologies with customers.
- Support to find additional customers and finance to scale-up your business.

4.1.5 Tech Supplier Eligibility Criteria

All Tech Suppliers must abide to the general requirements described in the Guidelines to be considered eligible for Better Factory preliminary call.

4.1.5.1 What types of entities are eligible?

Better Factory is looking for Tech suppliers established in an eligible country as defined in subsection 3.2.

Technology Suppliers refer to companies (SMEs or Mid-Caps) that develop, produce and sell software applications and/or hardware to be implemented in manufacturing companies.

A **SME** must comply with the <u>Commission Recommendation 2003/361/EC</u> (available here: <u>http://ec.europa.eu/growth/smes/business-friendly-environment/sme-definition_en</u>).

As a summary, the criteria which define a SME are:

- Headcount in Annual Work Units (AWU) less than 250;
- **Annual turnover** less or equal to EUR 50 million OR annual balance sheet total less or equal to EUR 43 million.

Regarding **Mid-Caps**, there is no common EU definition. Better Factory, defines a Mid-Cap as:

• A company that is not an SME and has a headcount of up to 3,000 AWU.

Please note that a SME or a Mid-Cap owned by a company bigger than a Mid-Cap – i.e., having a shareholder with more than 50% of the shares whose headcount is higher than 3,000 – will be considered as a Big Company and will not be able to apply to this Call.

4.1.5.2 Eligible countries

Only eligible organisations legally established in any of the eligible countries will be eligible for the Better Factory calls. The eligible countries include:

- The Member States of the European Union: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain and Sweden;
- H2020 Associated Countries, as identified in Article 7 of the Horizon 2020 Regulation: Iceland, Norway, Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia, Turkey, Israel, Moldova, Switzerland, Faroe Islands, Ukraine, Tunisia, Georgia and Armenia.
- United Kingdom.

4.1.5.3 Expertise and other experience criteria

The validated Technology Suppliers applicant should:

- Prove previous successful cases of collaboration with manufacturing companies.
- Have expertise and convincingly demonstrate experience on optimizing the following challenges in the manufacturing process:
 - Optimization of manufacturing resources (energy, material, space, water, reduction of CO₂ etc.)
 - Factory process flow automation
 - Automation and optimization of intra-factory logistics
 - o Collaborative and cognitive robotics
- As aforementioned, the following industrial sectors will be prioritised:
 - Plastic and Rubber;
 - Furniture and Wood;
 - Food and Agriculture;
 - \circ Construction;
 - Metal and Machinery;
 - $\circ~$ Textile and Leather.
- Have experience in working in collaborative international environments and be interested to commercialise results and experience gained out of this KTE.

• Convincingly demonstrate the interest, need and added value of collaborating with manufacturing companies and Artists on RAMP.

4.1.5.4 English language

English is the official language for the open calls communication, the applications and proposal. If the mandatory parts of the proposal are written in any other language, the entire proposal will not be eligible. If only the nonmandatory parts of the proposal are submitted in a language different from English, those parts will not be evaluated but the proposal will be still considered eligible.

4.1.6 Tech Supplier Pre-Selection Criteria and Process

The submitted applications will be validated by the Better Factory art pre-selection sub-committee. The validated applicant will be contacted by the Better Factory consortium and will receive further information on how to register on RAMP.

The validation process consists of:

4.1.6.1 Administrative and Eligibility Check

Call managers will evaluate the eligibility of the proposal according to the following criteria:

- Applicants are from an eligible country.
- The ability to work in English.
- All the mandatory fields in the application form are filled.
- The applicants provided sufficient information to prove their technology experience.

The eligibility check process will run on all the proposals submitted before the deadline. The applications that do not comply with the criteria above will be excluded and marked as ineligible.

Eligible applications will then be evaluated according to the Quality and Operational Capacity Criteria.

4.1.6.2 Quality and Operational Capacity Check

The second part of the validation process requires an in-depth assessment of the application. The quality and operational capacity of the submitted applications will be reviewed by consortium DIHs, which will determine whether the applicant is qualified for the matchmaking process. The following criteria will be considered:

Technology Criteria:


- 1. To what extent applicants have the experience and technological tools and competences in their technology challenges to successfully collaborate in a KTE.
- 2. To what extent applicants address one of the industrial sectors being prioritised by Better Factory.
- 3. To what extent there is real business benefit for the Technology supplier to reach the market growth and commercialisation of the solution, together with presence in national and international markets.

While the call is open, the Better Factory sub-committee for Tech Supplier applicants will analyse periodically the applications received. The consortium will inform the pre-selected applicants by e-mail.





5.1 ADMINISTRATIVE ASPECTS

What is Better Factory?

Better Factory brings together key actors in the European technology, art and innovation landscape to provide an integrated framework and a European network to deliver a standardised solution for **Manufacturing Companies** to invent and manufacture new and personalised products and create services around them.

Through the Individual Calls, the applicants have the opportunity:

- 1. to enter the pre-selection process for Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps, Artists and Tech Suppliers,
- 2. to be assisted in the matchmaking process by the Better Factory consortium,
- 3. to form a team, known as Knowledge Transfer Experiment
- 4. to create and submit the Full Proposal in the 2nd Better Factory Open Call

Why should you apply?

If you are a manufacturing SME/Mid-Cap, an artist or a tech supplier who wants to work in a consortium composed of one of each of the three entities, then Better Factory will help you identify the most adequate partners to engage in a set of one-year collaborative experiments to redesign manufacturers product portfolio. The formed consortia will submit the full proposal with a chance to access a variety of services and technology and EUR 200,000 funding.

Who can apply?

Only individual applications from:

- Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps
- Artists
- Technology suppliers

Manufacturing companies and Tech Suppliers can be of the type of SME/Mid-Cap. The Artist member of the consortium can be either of the type of SME/Mid-Cap or a self-employed individual. All entities must be registered in a Member State of the EU, in a H2020 Associated Country or in UK.

Please refer to the <u>Guidelines for Applicants</u> for more details.

What is a KTE?

KTE stands for Knowledge Transfer Experiments. The consortium constituted from one manufacturing company, one artist and one technology supplier are referred to as a **KTE**. The collaboration within the project will enable the members to exchange knowledge and ideas on resolving issues and improving solutions. Technical mentors will guide the technical implementation of the KTEs, provide expertise for resolving technical issues and ensure that the solution is beyond the current state-of-the-art.

What is the Knowledge Transfer Program about?

9 most innovative KTEs in the 2nd Better Factory Open call for Full Proposals will be selected to participate in the 16-month Better Factory Knowledge Transfer Program. Throughout the program, selected consortia will engage in a 3-stages support program: Knowledge Co-creation, Knowledge Transfer and Knowledge Scale-up. Based on the results of the Milestone Reviews, each KTE will receive the pertinent instalments of the funding as specified in the <u>Guidelines for Applicants</u>.

Can we apply for the Call for Full Proposals if we did not participate in individual calls and the matchmaking process?

Yes, consortia from one manufacturing company, one artist and one tech supplier, formed outside the matchmaking process are eligible to apply, as long as they comply with the eligibility criteria defined in the <u>Guidelines for Applicants</u>.

Are there any differences in the evaluation between consortia formed through the RAMP matchmaking process and the outsiders?

No, all eligible applicant consortia will be considered equally according to the eligibility and scoring criteria defined in the <u>Guidelines for Applicants</u>.

What happens if I do not submit my application within the deadline?

We do not accept applications after the deadline. We strongly encourage you not to wait until the last minute to submit your proposal. Failure of meeting the submission deadline for any reason, including extenuating circumstances, will result in the rejection of the proposal.

How long does it take to fill in the application?

The application form must be submitted individually by each category of eligible applicant through the Better Factory microsites. The completion of the application can take 1 to 3 days. Please refer to the specific <u>Guidelines</u> to fully understand the required information and see the application form per each applicant.

You will be able to add contributors to your application so that your team (if it's the case) can tackle their application area and you will be done quicker.

Considering that specific character limits have been established for some sections of the online application form, we encourage you to keep your proposal focused on the requested information keeping in mind that this pre-selection process is a competitive one and the most suitable applicants will be pre-selected.

We also recommend that you start the submission process quite early before the deadline in order to avoid last minute circumstances.

Can an applicant submit two applications?

Since this is an individual application where the purpose is to highlight the challenges of your manufacturing business (in the case of the manufacturing SMEs/Mid-caps, prove your artistic expertise in the case of the Artists and describe the technology you own and can contribute with in the manufacturing sector for tech suppliers), only one application per entity will be considered. The first application to enter the pre-selection process will be considered for validation by the pre-selection sub-committee which will evaluate proposals every two weeks. Subsequent applications will not be considered.

Which are the eligibility criteria to assess the applications?

The proposals will be pre-selected according to the eligibility criteria described in each of the <u>Guidelines</u> for individual applicants.

Which are the pre-selection phases and the expected schedule?

All submitted individual applications will enter the pre-selection process every two weeks. However, be aware that this timeframe might be altered depending on the number of proposals submitted. Irrespective of the results, all applicants will receive an email with the outcome of the pre-selection process

Does the Artist or Tech Supplier have to invoice the Manufacturing Company?

In case they are pre-selected and join a consortium granted the financing at the subsequent phases, there should be no invoicing among the members of the consortium, as the financial support is equity-free grant

and should be registered as such in each member's accountancy. However, it is advisable to consult your local tax advisor to make sure you are fully compliant with national fiscal regulations.

Regarding the eligibility criteria, could you please clarify whether non-profit SMEs (according to Commission Recommendation 2003/361/EC) are also eligible?

Yes, The for profit or not-for-profit nature of the SME is irrelevant.

This aspect is clarified in Article 1 of the EC recommendation 2003/361. The important concept is the active engagement in an economic activity, irrespective of its legal form.

Does the funding count as a de-minimis grant to be considered for our company's de-minimis budget?

No, the funding through Better Factory projects is not considered a *de-minimis* grant, hence it will not be cumulated with another de-minimis financing you may have.

5.2 TECHNICAL ASPECTS

What is TRL?

The TRL - Technology Readiness Level – is an indicator of the maturity level of a particular technology. This measurement system provides a common understanding of technology status and addresses the entire innovation chain.

There are nine technology readiness levels, TRL 1 being the lowest and TRL 9 the highest. Please refer to <u>Annex G of the General Annexes</u> to the Work Programme 2016/17 for a full description of TRLs.

Who retains the IP rights? Does the tech supplier and artist have to give away their content to the manufacturer?

From the perspective of the Better Factory consortium, IPR remains property of individual members within the applicant consortia. At the level of the consortium formed for the purpose of the Better Factory project, this aspect can and should be regulated internally, amongst the consortium members.

Is 3D printing included as a topic for proposals?

3D printing is not in the scope of Better Factory. However, we can support the "Logistics optimisation", "Production planning", "Resource optimisation" and "Human-Robot collaboration" in a 3D printing facility.

Does digitisation refer only to the digitisation of manufacturing processes or also to the digitisation of products and their manufacture, but produced independently of the digitisation of their manufacture?

The full proposal application will have to revolve around both a product related challenge as well as factory automation deployment. The boundaries we set for the latter are the four categories of automation as mentioned in the full proposal template:

- For the deployment of collaborative robots working with humans.
- For the deployment of mobile robots for automation of factory logistics.
- For resource optimization (materials, water, energy, CO2, etc.)
- For production planning and simulation.

Any proposal that focuses on the deployment of automation in the SME factory in at least two of the abovementioned categories is eligible. You can see that the first two categories focus on direct robot integration into processes and logistics, whereas the latter two have a broader scope.

Whether your desire to digitize products/models/technologies are eligible depends upon their fit with at least two of the above categories.

5.3 ARTISTIC ASPECTS

Can an Artist be an SME?

Yes, the Artist can be legally constituted as an SME. Please check the <u>Guidelines for Artists</u> for the eligibility criteria for Artists.

In case the artist is a SME, does it have the obligation to be registered with the NACE Code 9003 Artistic creation?

Yes. The NACE 9003 category includes independent artists whose main activity concerns the creation of original works of art. These can be individuals or art studios that could be seen as SMEs. The creation of original works of art is leading in this definition. Therefore, it excludes industrial product designers or industrial design studios as artists. If you run an art business without this code, you do not comply with this eligibility criterion, as your business can not be considered an artist.

Is an art institution eligible for the individual application?

No, art institution are not eligible entities.

Where can we find an art mentor?

The art mentoring is a service provided to selected consortia by Better Factory partners. An art mentor will be available to selected KTE during the program, not at the proposal stage

Is it possible to apply for this call as a team?

It is not eligible to apply as a team to this call. The call is open to individual artists.

6 Following Steps

The individual open calls presented in this first version of the deliverable are necessary for an adequate matchmaking between Manufacturing SMEs/Mid-Caps, Artists and Technology Suppliers. The formal Open Call for KTEs involve consortia composed of one entity among these 3 categories and, although it is not mandatory that the proposals come from the matchmaking process, it is a fact that this matchmaking and the support provided by the Better Factory consortium will have an impact in the quality of the proposals.

Guide for Applicants, FAQs and Better Factory Application Form

The package of documents needed for the formal Open Call will be elaborated in detail during the matchmaking process, when the Better Factory consortium will have all the elements to define the technical and artistic challenges, to fine-tune the selection process and its criteria, and to select and train adequate internal evaluators and Jury members.

Lessons learned from the individual calls will also be taken into account, in the elaboration of these documents.

Formal announcement of the Open Call

The formal call announcement document, together with the Guidelines for Applicants have been sent to the Project Officer one month before the launching of the Open call for proposals.

As stated in the guidelines of the individual calls, the aim is to launch the call in September 2022.

The Open Call will be addressed to consortia composed of 1 Manufacturing SME/Mid-Cap, 1 Artist and 1 Technology Supplier. The call will be opened for proposals submitted via EoI and supported by the project through the matchmaking process (as described in detail in this first version of the deliverable), but also for the proposals submitted by outsiders without requesting additional support.
